PARENT/TEACHER/STUDENT CONVERSATIONS

SIX WAYS YOU CAN HELP YOUR CHILD AT SCHOOL

At St Patrick's we have had a long history of a strong partnership between home and school. In fact, next week we begin to celebrate **60 years** of that partnership!

We believe that your support in educating your child is essential for your child's success as both a learner and as person. With this in mind, I write to

you on behalf of our teaching staff and school Leadership to remind you of some of the ways you can help bring out the best in your child as a student at St Patrick's School. Here are six ways you can help your child at school.

Organisation:

- Help your child be organised and ready for school each day. Being ready for school each day means that a child comes to school less anxious and ready to learn. This includes having all the equipment they need for the day.
- Whenever you can, encourage your child to read nightly and undertake social learning outside of school hours. Regular literacy and numeracy practise relative to the child's age and needs, is a way parents can support their child's learning. Cultural learning is equally important in developing a child's identity.
- 3. Ensure that your child arrives to school on time. That is, before 9.50am. This means your child will begin the day with the rest of the class and will not miss out on vital instruction by the teacher to prepare them for the day.
- 4. Ensure that your child attends school regularly. Over the course of a child's 13 years at school, regular absenteeism can have serious impact on a child's learning, especially in the primary years when fundamental learning takes place. We encourage families to keep to a minimum the amount of time your child is absent from school.
- 5. Avoid picking up your child early from school unless it is absolutely essential. This, like being late to school, reduces the amount of time your child spends in quality learning time. Just missing 10 minutes of school each day over the course of a year, a child can miss out on over a week of school. We especially remind families that collecting children early during school events like **school assemblies**, impacts on a child's connection with school and their peers. These events are an essential part of learning to respect and value the work and efforts of other children.
- Join our community events that celebrate children and their learning as opportunities arise.

Children love to see their parents at school. This shows that you value their learning and their school. Events like our recent 'Meet the Teacher' evening was a great example of community involvement in your child's school.





PREMIER'S BE ACTIVE CHALLENGE INFORMATION

Premier's be active Challenge Guidelines

What is the Premier's be active Challenge?

• The Premier's *be active* Challenge is a physical activity program introduced by the Premier in 2007 to encourage students to be more active more often and to improve student health and wellbeing.

Who can participate:

• **All students**. The Premier's *be active* Challenge is open to all South Australian students from Reception to year 12, as well as home schools and families.

What must students do:

The Challenge requires students to do at least 60 minutes of physical activity on at least 5 days of the week for at least 4 weeks from the start of the school year until the end of week 10, term 3.

• Students must record their physical activity on the relevant **student recording booklets** or **class progress charts**.

• A teacher or parent/carer must endorse the student physical activity record to indicate that the student has met the participation requirements.

Appropriate physical activity: Physical activity level

To meet their daily requirement, students should undertake 60 minutes of moderate to vigorous physical activity (MVPA). Examples include riding a bike, playing tag games, dancing, playing sport, walking to or from school. Physical activity does not need to be in one block of 60 minutes – it can be shorter amounts of activity that add up to 60 minutes.

The Challenge will finish at the end of Week 8 Term 3. Please return sheets by Thursday the 12th of September to the front office.

AMBULANCE COVER

Ambulance cover

The school has ambulance cover for students who have accidents here at school or while on a school organised event. However, this cover does not include students with a pre-existing condition such as asthma and anaphylaxis or reactions to allergies.

We will ring an ambulance if we need support in administering first aid, however in the case of students with pre-existing conditions the parents will be charged by Ambulance SA for their service.

This can cost upward of \$900 so we strongly encourage you to take out ambulance cover, particularly

if your child has a pre-existing health condition.

A friendly reminder to those families, who do not have a direct debit set up, that Term 1 school fees are due by the last day of Term 1 the 12/4/24.

We offer direct debit, BPay, EFTPOS and also direct deductions from Centrelink payments to cater to the changing financial needs of our families at St Patrick's School. When the direct debit payment option is selected your school fee payment is calculated over the full school year right up until the 31st of December 2024. This means smaller payments are required, making this method the most affordable way to budget for your commitment. 
School Card 2024 must be applied for online each year and the instructions are in this newsletter. If you have any problems please come and see me if you are having any issues.




